THERE was a most important Grand National development at the eleventh hour when "Jack" Fawcus, the leading amateur who joined the professional ranks recently, broke his collarbone when riding in the opening hurdle event here to-day, and will thus not be able to ride Gregalach to-morrow.

Gregalach has been a horse of many Aintree pilots since Everest—who also broke a collarbone some time back—won the National. It was a real bit of hard luck for Fawcus to-day. Whether all the old timers approved the Fawcus style or not at Aintree the "live" partnership had worked delightfully at Newbury. Before Fawcus had been free by the accident to Grakle, Parvin had been approached to ride Gregalach, so one of the original plans will hold good after all.

Fawcus fell at the second hurdle when riding Pahokee. Leading riders rarely take a mount in a "chase beforehand, but a hurdle event is reckoned different. For instance, Mr. Bostwick, the pilot of Dusty Foot to-morrow, won in bold style again on his American-bred champion Flaming.
